



Pass in B.Com/BBA/BBM/BBS or equivalent degree with not less than 50% marks or CGPA 2.00

Applicants provisionally selected for admission will have to appear for an interview before the Principal on the specified date.

Certificates to be produced at the time of the interview

- ◆ Transfer Certificate
- ◆ Conduct Certificate
- ◆ Birth Certificate/ S.S.L.C. Book
- ◆ Plus Two/Degree Examination Certificate (Original)/Marklist, Provisional Certificate

2 Passport size photographs of the candidate should be produced at the time of interview

The candidates appearing for the interview must be accompanied by their parent/guardian. The Principal reserves the right to refuse admission to any candidate who has been called for without assigning any reason.

Enrollment

1. The candidates who are selected after the interview will be enrolled immediately on payment of the fees prescribed. Fee once collected will not be refunded.

2. Fees should be paid within two weeks of the commencement of each semester.

Withdrawals

- ◆ Transfer certificate will be issued only on the production of the application in the prescribed form.
- ◆ Request for caution deposit should be submitted along with the application of Transfer certificate in the prescribed form. Caution deposit has to be collected within 6 months from the date of course completion.
- ◆ Students leaving the college in the middle of the term must pay the full fees of the course, relaxation in this order is the discretionary power of the Management and caution deposit will be released only after the completion of the course.

Scholarships/Awards

- ◆ The CCMT Education Cell has constituted the Chinmaya Education Cell Scholarship for students who are academically good but need financial assistance to continue their studies. The scholarship is shared by the CCMT Cell and the Institution.

Eligibility :

The scholarship will be awarded to any two students from I to III DC classes of the college.

- ◆ The students should have done well in academics scoring 80% or more in the aggregate.
- ◆ Their annual family income should not exceed Rs. 1,50,000/-.

To Parents and Guardians

- ◆ Parents are requested not to enter classrooms and meet the teachers during class hours. If they wish to meet the teachers they may do so only after getting prior permission from the Principal.
- ◆ Parents should encourage their wards to take active part in co-curricular activities of the college and the university cultural festivals.
- ◆ Parents are requested to co-operate with the college authorities by taking interest in the progress of their wards and enforcing regularity, punctuality and discipline.
- ◆ The Principal, HOD's and teachers can be met during college hours on all working days between 9.00 a.m. to 3.00 p.m.


Student Programmes :

- ◆ The classroom sessions are enlivened with case studies, role plays, student presentations, activities and games so as to make the learning process a participatory one.
- ◆ The college has initiated industry-institute interface programme wherein experts from various industries address the students on different topics. This programme is aimed at giving the right exposure to our students and also giving them a chance to interact with the corporate players and subject experts.
- ◆ The college undertakes regular study tours and industry visits for the students to enable them to get a first hand experience on the intricacies of real life business.
- ◆ The students actively take part in all Seminars, Symposia, Presentation meet and the like which help them to sharpen their intellect and at the same time develop their personalities.

- ◆ The college conducts Talent Contest to bring out the hidden talents of the students. The student who excel in the competitions are selected to represent the college in the University Arts Festivals.
- ◆ Tutorial system has been followed very effectively. The Tutors help each student to find out their strength and weaknesses, so that they can work together on building up their strength and minimising their weaknesses, if any.
- ◆ The college has initiated a Community Service Scheme wherein students and staff engage themselves in community development programmes like awareness building, vocational training and so on.
- ◆ Individual attention and counselling are given to each student. Unit tests are conducted regularly and parents are intimated about the progress of their wards from time to time through the Parent-Teacher Meetings that are held regularly.
- ◆ Continuous internal evaluation is done following the guide lines of the University and marks are awarded to the students based on their internal performance.
It is compulsory that all the students should participate in the Mission activities conducted by the Acharyas and the Mission members in the college.

Code of Conduct

- a) Students are expected to be neat and clean and modestly dressed on the campus.
- b) Every student should greet teachers and elders respectfully by saying "Hari Om".
- c) Students shall always behave with dignity and courtesy.
- d) When a teacher enters the classroom the students shall rise up and remain standing until the teacher takes her/his seat and asks them to be seated.
- e) Each and every student shall maintain discipline at any cost.
- f) Students are forbidden from participating in any meeting or agitation directed against the authorities of the Government or the college.
- g) No student shall join any organization outside the college without the permission of the Principal. If any student is found guilty of discipline such as organizing demonstration or strikes she shall be immediately dismissed from the college.
- h) No student shall disfigure the walls or furniture or windows by writing on them. If anyone damages or destroys the college property, she will have to pay the cost of the damage.



- i) Students are strictly forbidden from making complaints in a body or from addressing any authority collectively.
- j) Mobile phone, photo camera or video inside the college campus is strictly prohibited.
- k) If any student violates the rules and regulations indicated above, the Principal has absolute authority to expel her from the college.
- l) No student shall leave the class room or laboratory without the permission of the Teacher-in-Charge.
- m) Fee once paid will not be refunded under any circumstances.
- n) The college and hostel caution deposit will be refunded only after the completion of the course.
- o) The management reserves the right of not allowing those students who are involved in any police/court cases, to enter the college/hostel premises.
- p) The decision of the management of Chinmaya Arts and Science College with respect to any administrative and academic matters is final and shall bind the students at all time.

Library Rules

- 1) The library shall be kept open on all working days from 9.00 am to 4.30 pm. The library timings may be extended on request.
- 2) The issue counter shall be closed one hour before the closing of the library.
- 3) To get enrolled as a member, a student must fill and sign the Library

Enrollment Form.

- 4) Membership card / Student identity card must be shown at the counter on request.
- 5) No personal belongings are permitted inside the library.
- 6) Every member must enter her name, membership No. and time in the register at the library counter.
- 7) Silence shall be strictly observed in the Library.
- 8) No student shall damage or disfigure books or other property of the Library. The students has to replace such books or other property damaged, or lost or make payments for the value there of as decided by the Librarian.
- 9) A Member who loses the library ticket shall make a written request to the Librarian. A duplicate ticket shall be issued on payment of Rs. 100/- for each such ticket issued after a lapse of two weeks from the date of such request.
- 10) Borrower's tickets are not transferable. Members shall be responsible for misuse of borrower's ticket.
- 11) Borrowers must satisfy themselves about the physical conditions of the books before borrowing. Otherwise they shall be responsible for any damage of mutilation noticed at the time of return of the book.
- 12) Reference books and periodicals are not ordinarily issued.
- 13) All books on loan shall be returned within a week unless specified otherwise or on recall by the Librarian.
- 14) Books on special demand may be lent for shorter period as decided by the librarian.
- 15) Issue of books may be terminated at any time and recalled by the order of the Librarian.
- 16) An overdue charge of Rs. 1/- per volume per day shall be charged if a book is kept beyond the period of loan for first three days and it shall increase by Rs. 1/- after every additional three days.
- 17) If the due date falls on holiday, the books may be returned on the next working day without overdue charge. If not the overdue charge will be collected from the due date onwards.
- 18) Members who repeatedly fail to return books on the due date will lose the privilege of membership of the Library.
- 19) A member who infringer rules shall forfeit her privilege of admission to and borrowing of books from the library.



Attendance

A student shall be permitted to appear for the semester examination, only if she secures not less than 75% attendance in each semester. Condonation of shortage of attendance may be granted according to existing university rules. A student who is not eligible for such condonation shall repeat the course when it is offered again.
